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## 25 Essay Topics that Worked

These are essay topics that worked for some of my former students. The purpose of this list is to give you ideas, not to limit you or suggest you should write an essay that has already been written.

Tell your own story. It's inside of you already!

This is just a partial list. I have worked on many, many more wonderful essays on every topic under the sun. In my experience, just about anything can be turned into a college essay as long as you care about it.

**Sports:** I confess I am not a fan of sports, but, wow, I have had the pleasure of reading some good ones! The key to a sports essay is avoid the how-we-won-the-big-game or how-we-lost-the-big-game stereotype. Look for observations about yourself within your experience of playing a sport.

- 1. When I joined the girls' wrestling team at my school, I found out I am stronger than I knew.
- I was the slowest runner on my school's track team, and it meant the world to me when
  my teammates cheered for me anyway and encouraged me to stay on the team.
- My school's football team suffered from coaching turnover and low participation, but I loved the experience and would do anything just to play the game.

- 4. I was a golf prodigy expected to turn pro as a young adult, but I got a condition called the yips, and now my goal is to finish in the top half.
- My teammates on the swim team don't understand why I love backstroke, but to me it's the only stroke there is and if it weren't for backstroke, I wouldn't bother swimming.
- I was tired of being the girl who got bullied and was always afraid, so I joined a roller derby team, where I learned to be tough and fearless.

**Passion essays:** These are my favorite! Don't write about something you love to do. Get to the truth of why you love this particular thing. What is it about XYZ that lights you up?

- 7. Baking Christmas cookies is a competitive sport in my competitive family, and I am proud to say I have won more than I have lost over the years.
- 8. My mother joked that I should take up crocheting granny squares after we saw a chic crocheted purse in a shop window. I took that challenge, and I have not stopped crocheting since and never will.
- 9. My favorite holiday is Halloween, and every year I come up with ways to ramp up the trick-or-treating experience at my house for the kids in my neighborhood.

**Unique experience**: I love these memorable essays about a unique and sometimes wild experience. The secret to this essay's success is to focus on your reaction to the unfamiliar circumstances.
